Review

- Two goals:
 - Creating 111 New Shelter Beds
 - Rehousing 161 households from unsheltered homelessness
- \$13.9m total to spend between now and January 10th, 2024.
- COIC can access up to \$3.6m; the remaining \$10.3m is available after July 1, 2023, and will be reimbursement based.
- Our responsibility is to meet the State goals

Updates to Rehousing Goal

- **Rehousing numbers are not exclusive to MAC funded projects** – Central Oregon gets to count any individual rehoused since January 10th, 2023 in the metrics it reports to the State.
- **Unsheltered Status** – An individual must be unsheltered at the time of “initial engagement”. Initial engagement policies are up to each Continuum of Care to decide. HLC has an established initial engagement policy.
 - Once initial engagement criteria has been confirmed for an unsheltered individual, the individual is eligible to utilize shelter while waiting for a successful rehousing placement.

HLC Initial Engagement Policy

- CoC Policy – Initial Engagement is considered the time the most recent standardized assessment (IE: VI-SPDT) was given.
